A public hearing has been set for Monday, May 5, 2014 at 9:30 a.m. Jennifer Buford, Community Development Director for East Central Planning and Development, explained to the Board that this is a competitive grant and Lauderdale County will be competing with other counties and cities for this grant. The deadline to apply is May 16. The motion was passed unanimously.
