1. SUBMITTED QUESTIONS RESPONSES:

- 1. Can you provide what the average number of total billed hours for each of the previous 3 years were? That information is not available/unknown, as this will be a new service as needed.
- 2. Is there a specific type of transport vehicle(s) required? No specific make or model. However, it must be equipped with a cage for offender transport and passenger doors that are unable to be opened from the inside. It is recommended that vehicles have fewer than 50,000 miles and be in good mechanical order.
- 3. Are vehicles pricing billed on a monthly per vehicle basis separate from, or included in the bill pricing? Vehicles should be included in the hourly pricing rate.
- 4. Do you use any hospitals that do not allow 3rd party or contracted parties to be armed? No, all hospitals require 2 officers and 1 must be armed.
- 5. Can an average number of requests for transfer be supplied by county and out of State? There is no data to provide, as this will be a new service being added.
- 6. Who is currently the provider for these services? There is no provider, as this will be a new added service.
- 7. Is there any specialized training required when transporting a juvenal offender? Yes, it's recommended that officers have completed juvenile offender incarceration and transport with a minimum of 20 hours training class. Additionally, you should have a good familiarity with applicable federal and Mississippi law regarding the care custody and control of juvenile offenders.

8.	Are the transport offenders released from our custody at time of arrival, or are officers required to
	wait for the return of said offender for transport back? Offenders will be in custody of the vendor
	from departure of Lauderdale County housing facility until returned.

9.	Is there an average number of transports that occur simultaneously throughout the year? Again,
	there is not any data to provide, as this is a new service.
